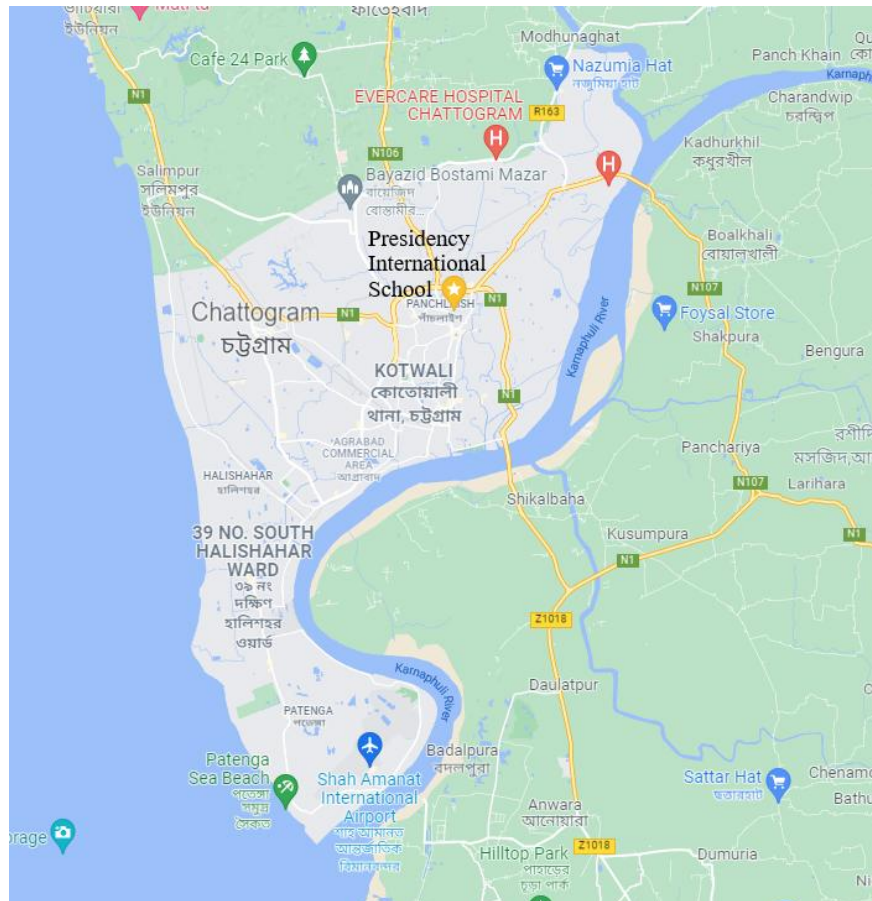


## School Profile 2022

### Description of school and community

- Type of school: A co-ed independent school enrolling over thousands of students in classes Playgroup- A level. Presidency International School is affiliated with the *Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE)* since its inception in 1998. The CAIE centre number of the school is BD205. The school is located at the heart of Chittagong city of Bangladesh. The city spans about 2510 km<sup>2</sup> with the population of more than 5.2 million and enjoys a diversified economic base. There are about 30 English Medium schools offering education in British or American curriculum alongside numerous National Curriculum schools in the city.



- **School Mission:** Education aims at making a child a qualified and dignified person in the context of competitive and contemporary social background, through proper blooming of his/ her dormant genius. Along with modern and cutting-edge technology based teaching, only moral and ethical teaching can build up a child as a balanced and ideal person. - **Curricula available:** Besides taking preparatory classes for GCE O level and A level syllabuses of Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE), students must take classes in Mathematics, English, Bengali, Art, Computer Science and Social studies for all 10 years of Primary and Secondary schools (1<sup>st</sup> -10<sup>th</sup> grade). Presidency follows the Cambridge Primary, Lower Secondary curriculum for its Junior and Middle School sections. Besides, Presidency does a rigorous research on the available curricula, Bangladesh National Curriculum and CAIE pilot projects, and produces books and teaching aids for Bengali, Art and Crafts, Bangladesh Studies and Religious Studies to enrich students' knowledge at the Primary and Lower Secondary level.

**GCE O level:** Students select subjects at the end of 7<sup>th</sup> grade and starts preparatory course from 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Students sit for GCE O level examinations at 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade under Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE). As per the choice of subjects, they must take *entire Slot 1 and Slot 2 or Slot 3*, and then choose subjects of their choice from *Slot 4*. Students selecting *Slot 2 (Science)* must enroll for practical examination and include 3 years of practical classes in their preparatory coursework.

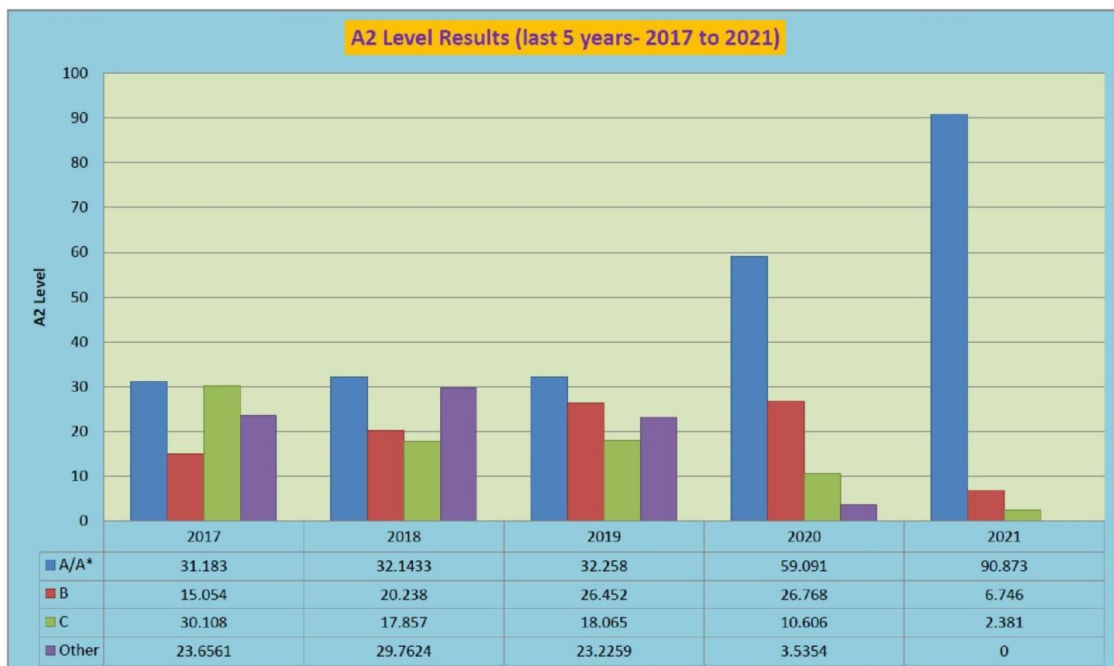
